I am currently priest-in-charge of St. Luke's, New Haven.

Since 2002 I have been licensed to the parishes of Littlemore and Sandford-on-Thames, where I served 2002-22 as a self-supporting minister.

I devised five 4-8 part parish courses ('*Reading the Lord's Prayer*', '*The Ministry of Listening*', '*Ministry for All Believers*', '*Speaking of Faith*', '*Ways of Believing*') which I delivered in my parishes and then made available via the Diocesan website.

I regularly teach one-day courses for clergy in my own and adjacent dioceses (most recently, 24/1/18, 'Gender and Sexuality in the Ancient World and the World of the Bible').

I have mentored groups of 5-6 curates of the diocese, for the (typically) three years of their curacy.

In 2021, 2022 I gave a day's teaching on 'The theology and ethics of Christian trust and entrustedness' to the Community of St. Anselm, Lambeth Palace, London.

In 2010-11 I devised and conducted the first national survey of non-stipendiary Anglican clergy; the report can be read at www.littlemorechurch.org. My recommendations for changes in the development and deployment of NSMs were accepted by the national Ministry Council, the Continuing Ministerial Development Panel and the House of Bishops Standing Committee and were taken forward in a number of dioceses. 2011-16 I acted as an advisor on NSM matters to the Ministry Division of the Church of England and to twelve dioceses; diocesan NSM officers remain in touch with me to discuss their ideas.
