



DEGREE PROGRAMS SNAPSHOT

Master of Divinity (3 years) The degree of Master of Divinity (M.Div.) certifies completion of a program of theological studies designed primarily, although not exclusively, to prepare the candidate for ordination to the Christian ministry.

Master of Arts in Religion (Comprehensive, 2 years) The degree of Master of Arts in Religion (M.A.R.) certifies either completion of a comprehensive program of study in preparation for one of the many forms of lay ministry or service, or completion of one of the concentrated programs of advanced study.

Master of Arts in Religion (Concentrated, 2 years) The concentrated M.A.R. program offers the opportunity to pursue advanced work in one of the disciplines of theological study.
